

## INFRASTRUCTURAL DEVELOPMENT

Pakyi Campus: Construction of a 220 capacity girls' boarding house which provides bigger bedrooms with balconies, washroom facilities and inviting spacious communal areas is ongoing.

The new residential facility is at 90% completion and is expected to be ready for boarding during the first term of the 2019/2020 academic year.



Accra Campus: Second phase of construction of the Accra campus has began at Ogbojo. The \$7 million project when completed will provide facilities including 47 classrooms, a general library, a 397-capacity auditorium, two laboratories, two ICT hubs, a media centre, two language rooms, learning and support centre, a conference room, and an administrative block among others.

The project is scheduled to be completed by July 2020.
